## **HOLY COMMUNION (Book of Common Prayer)**

The Order of Service may be found on page 294 of the Book of Common Prayer. The collect and readings are those given for the Third Sunday of Lent, page 133.

### **The Collect**

We beseech thee, Almighty God, look upon the hearty desires of thy humble servants, and stretch forth the right hand of thy Majesty, to be our defence against all our enemies; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

### **RECEIVING AT HOLY COMMUNION**

The recent alarm over swine flu has alerted us to the most hygienic way of receiving Holy Communion. The bread should be received into the hand rather than into the mouth, and should not be dipped into the wine, lest the wine touch the hand. Please also take care to keep fingers well away from the rim of the cup when you receive.

## **SUNG EUCHARIST (Common Worship)**

### **MINSTER SUNDAY SCHOOL**

The Minster Sunday School and Crèche meet during this service. Children and helpers, and any parents who wish to do so, may follow the cross out during the Gradual hymn, and return just before Communion. The Sunday School and Crèche are available to visitors as well as to regular members of the congregation. If, however, you prefer to keep your children with you throughout the service, that is fine.

The Eucharist in Lent begins with the solemn singing of the Litany by the choir as they pass round the nave. These are the main prayers for the church and the world, and all should kneel or sit while the procession enters. The words are printed in the service books on pages 10 and 11 and the setting today is by *King*.

After the Communion of the people, the President says the Post-Communion prayer. The choir then sing the hymn "Jesu, grant me this I pray" to a setting by Sir Edward Bairstow. The words are found at Hymn 382. Following this, all join in the prayer on page 21 before the final hymn, blessing and dismissal, as in the service books.

### **Collect**

Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain, and entered not into glory before he was crucified: mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

### **Post Communion**

Merciful Lord, grant your people grace to withstand the temptations of the world, the flesh and the devil, and with pure hearts and minds to follow you, the only God; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**The Offering** – As regular worshippers at the Minster, you are encouraged to plan your giving, by standing order where possible. All worshippers who are UK tax payers are asked to make their offering under Gift Aid, using either the standing order form or the envelope provided. We give 15% of the cash offering annually to other charitable causes, in consultation with the Minster Community Committee, as part of the mission of the wider church. The rest supports the day to day mission of York Minster.
